## CITY OF CONWAY SOUTH CAROLINA

## **EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER #1 - MAY 4, 2020**

- 1. **Purpose**: The purpose of the Emergency Order is to protect the health and safety of the Conway residents and visitors, including economic vitality and sustainability, by allowing certain steps to be taken to facilitate the systematic and safe reopening of businesses in the City of Conway, pursuant to Governor's Orders.
- 2. Temporary waiver of zoning code: Effective May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020, restaurants attempting to reopen and utilize outdoor dining, curbside, to-go, or delivery options available to them by the order of the Governor of the State of South Carolina, may place signage alerting the public of such services, where needed and reasonable, to accommodate such activities. This signage shall be temporary in nature and shall be removed upon request from the City Administrator. No permits or approvals shall be needed for this purpose. Beer and wine sales and consumption are allowed in the outdoor dining facility for any restaurant already licensed to sell wine and or beer.
- 3. **Temporary waiver of Community Appearance Board Review**: Effective May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020, restaurants as described in item 2, above, shall also be permitted to make minor modifications to their buildings and exterior sites to accommodate outdoor dining or curbside activities. These businesses shall apply to the Community Appearance Board within a reasonable amount of time should any modifications be permanent changes to the appearance of the building or structure.
- 4. **Temporary closures of alleyways or City parking facilities**: Effective May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020, the City Administrator is authorized to temporarily close alleys and/or parking spaces or lots to accommodate the installation of outdoor dining facilities for restaurants as described in item 2 above.
- 5. **Duration of Executive Order**: This Executive Order, and any subsequent amendment, shall remain in effect until rescinded by the City or subsequent Executive Order, or the expiration of the Declaration of the State of Emergency, whichever is first.
